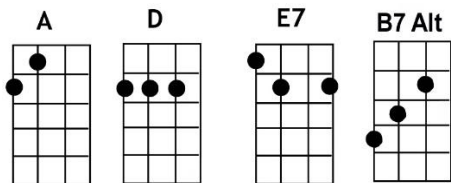


Cotton Jenny ~ written by Gordon Lightfoot
