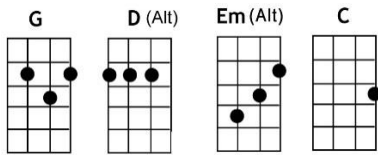


Wagon Wheel

INTRO/Count in: **Shelley** 1-2-3-4 Everyone strums: **[G] [D] [Em] [C] [G] [D] [C]**

[G] Headed down south to the **[D]** land of the pines
I'm **[Em]** thumbin' my way to **[C]** North Caroline
[G] Starin' up the road and **[D]** pray to God I see **[C]** headlights **[C]**
I **[G]** made it down the coast in **[D]** seventeen hours
[Em] Pickin' me a bouquet of **[C]** dogwood flowers
And I'm a **[G]** hopin' for Raleigh, I can **[D]** see my baby to-**[C]**-night **[C]**

CHORUS: So **[G]** rock me mama like a **[D]** wagon wheel
[Em] Rock me mama any **[C]** way you feel

Lost my **[Em]** money playin' poker so I **[C]** had to up and leave

(One Strum) [G] Walkin' to the south, **[D]** out of Roanoke
I caught a **[Em]** trucker out of Philly, had a **[C]** nice long toke
But **[G]** he's a-headed west from the **[D]** Cumberland Gap to **[C]** Johnson City, Tennessee
And I **[G]** gotta get a move on **[D]** fit for the sun, I hear my **[Em]** baby callin' my name,
